Conception

Chelsea Creek is a new residential development consisting of a number of luxurious high and low rise apartment buildings situated in a waterfront location around newly created canals and waterways. Various of these buildings come with stunning penthouse roof gardens with luxury facilities such as hot tubs, outdoor fireplaces, water features, and green walls and a combination of paved terraces and contemporary urban planting. They offer breathtaking views of the


meandering waterways around the buildings as well as of the nearby River Thames and the London skyline.

To create these luxury roof gardens on an inverted roof, the "Roof Garden" build up with FD 60 neo was used allowing for continuos drainage underneath the planters and paved areas. The vapour permeable Separation membrane TGV 21 was used to avoid creating a vapour barrier on top of the XPS insulation.
